Ketua Pegawai Eksekutif Fomema, Datuk Mohd Hatar Ismail menjelaskan masih ada pekerja asing yang gagal dalam pemeriksaan kesihatan walaupun setelah menjalani saringan kesihatan di negara asal.

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Tiga Daripada 100 Pekerja Asing Di Negara Ini Menghidap Penyakit Berbahaya - Fomema

KUALA LUMPUR, 4 Jan (Bernama) -- Kebanjiran pendatang asing bukan sahaja memberi kesan sosioekonomi di Malaysia malah turut menjejaskan kesihatan dan keselamatan negara.

Data Agensi Pemantauan dan Pemeriksaan Perubatan Pekerja Asing (Fomema) memperlihatkan nisbah tiga daripada 100 pekerja asing yang disaring menghidap penyakit berbahaya seperti batuk kering (Tuberkulosis/Tibi), Hepatitis B dan AIDS.

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"Ini baharu yang sah. Cuba bayangkan pekerja asing yang memang tidak ada permit, berapa ramai yang dijangkiti," katanya kepada Bernama.

Statistik Fomema menunjukkan hanya 1.2 juta pekerja asing di Malaysia mengambil pemeriksaan kesihatan setiap tahun.

Kongres Kesatuan Sekerja Malaysia (MTUC) dilaporkan berkata terdapat hampir tujuh juta pekerja asing di negara ini, termasuk pendatang haram.

Mohd Hatar berkata kes penyakit berbahaya yang paling tinggi di khalayak pekerja asing adalah Tibi, diikuti Hepatitis B dan AIDS.

"Penyakit Tibi boleh merebak melalui udara dan mereka (pekerja asing) gemar menaiki pengangkutan awam seperti bas dan tren," katanya.

Fomema ditubuhkan pada tahun 1997 bertujuan menguruskan ujian saringan kesihatan bagi semua pekerja asing yang berdaftar untuk bekerja di negara ini.

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Three out of 100 foreign workers suffer from infectious diseases — Fomema

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KUALA LUMPUR: The influx of foreign immigrants has not only resulted in adverse socio-economic impact on Malaysia but has also affected national health and security. Data gathered by the Foreign Workers' Medical Examination Monitoring Agency (Fomema) revealed that three out of 100 foreign workers who underwent health screening suffered from dangerous diseases such as Tuberculosis (TB), Hepatitis B and AIDS.

Fomema chief executive officer Datuk Mohd Hatar Ismail said there were still foreign workers who failed their medical examination here even after undergoing health screening in their country of origin.

"This figure involves those with valid documents. Imagine those without permits, how many of them have infectious diseases," he said. Fomema statistics show that only 1.2 million foreign workers in Malaysia undergo medical examinations every year. The Malaysian Trades Union Congress (MTUC) reportedly said there were nearly seven million foreign workers, including illegal immigrants, in the country. Mohd Hatar said the most prevalent dangerous disease among foreign workers was TB, followed by Hepatitis B and AIDS.

"TB is an air-borne disease and they (the foreign workers) often use public transportation such as buses and trains," he said.

Fomema, set up in 1997, is aimed at managing health screening tests for all registered foreign workers in the country. — Bernama
